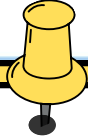

It has been another busy term and we wanted to share with you some of what has been happening in classes throughout school.

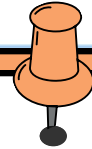
RECEPTION

The reception children have been exploring the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants. They have also enjoyed planting seeds and bulbs. They loved lots of outdoor learning especially learning about life cycles. All the reception children have been fascinated by their class caterpillars, watching them make cocoons, then grow into butterflies and finally releasing them.



YEAR 1

This term has been bursting with hands-on, exciting learning adventures in Year 1! In Science, the children rolled up their sleeves to grow their very own sunflowers, watching in awe as they transformed day by day. Over in Art, they got creative with clay, crafting beautiful leaf sculptures as part of their sculpture topic. And in History, the children have been time-travelling—exploring what school life was like in the past and comparing it to today. They even uncovered fascinating facts about the rich history of our very own Haxey CE Primary!



YEAR 2

Year 2 have been looking at food and nutrition as part of their DT topic this term. They have thought about whether food comes from animals or plants and the different food groups that each food belongs to. They then designed their own healthy pizzas by adding plenty of fruits and vegetables. It was hot work cooking them, but we think you will agree that they look delicious!.



YEAR 3

In Year 3, the children have been studying the Ancient Egyptians. They loved learning about the mummification process. They made their own Canopic jars, removed internal organs and mummified each other - it was a messy day! As part of their sculpture unit in art, the children learned how artists can be influenced by where they live. They looked at Mexican art and made their own Mexican cactus pots.

YEAR 4

Year 4 have been exploring Ancient Egyptian art through sculpture, using clay to create their own Egyptian Canopic jars. The children began by researching traditional Egyptian decorative styles. Then, using clay, they skilfully modelled their pots by hand, demonstrating excellent craftsmanship and patience. The children painted them using vibrant acrylic paints, adding intricate patterns inspired by Ancient Egyptian art. The final pieces look fantastic and reflect the hard work and creativity of the whole class. Well done, Year 4!
